The Brave Raiders and Northstars Organizations

The Brave Raiders Hockey Club and the Edmonton Northstars Athletic Club are volunteer operated, non-profit organizations, who organize and administer minor hockey within the clubs Operating Areas. An Executive Committee is formed from the general membership to carry out this mandate.

The Brave Raider Operating Area consists of the 9 Communities located north of the Yellowhead and east of 50th Street, including Bannerman, Fraser, Evergreen, South Clareview, Homesteader, Hairsine, Horsehills, Miller and Brintnell.

The Northstars Operating Area consists of the Communities located South of the Yellowhead, East of 97st, South of 137 Ave and West of 50th Street, including Beverly, Beacon, Newton, Montrose, Eastwood, Parkdale/Cromdale, Alberta Avenue, Delton, McCauley, Virginia Park, Killarney, Rosslyn, Glengarry, Delwood, Balwin, Westwood, Spruce Avenue, Riverdale, Rossdale, Griesbach, Boyle Highlands and Belvedere.

Program Information

The age division for the various categories are listed below, based upon the player age on December 31st of the current season. All players residing in the City of Edmonton must register and play hockey in the EMHA District in which they reside.

The Executive Committee consists of elected members with elections held yearly at the Annual General Meetings. (Northstars last Sunday in May, Brave Raiders first Sunday June). Appointed Positions and Sub-Committees are formed to oversee or undertake specific projects such as evaluations, tournaments, discipline, etc. The Executive Committee and Board Members meet once a month, excluding the month of July. Brave Raiders Executive Meetings generally are at 7:00pm on the 3rd Monday of the Month, a schedule of the meetings are on the website at www.braveraiders.com. Northstar Executive Meetings are at 7:00pm on the 1st Sunday of the Month. (December Christmas General Meeting may be moved to meet the needs of the organization).

Together the Northstars and the Brave Raiders provide a high quality developmental program for all players at all levels. Our Program not only develops their hockey skills but also provides fun and a challenge to each player.

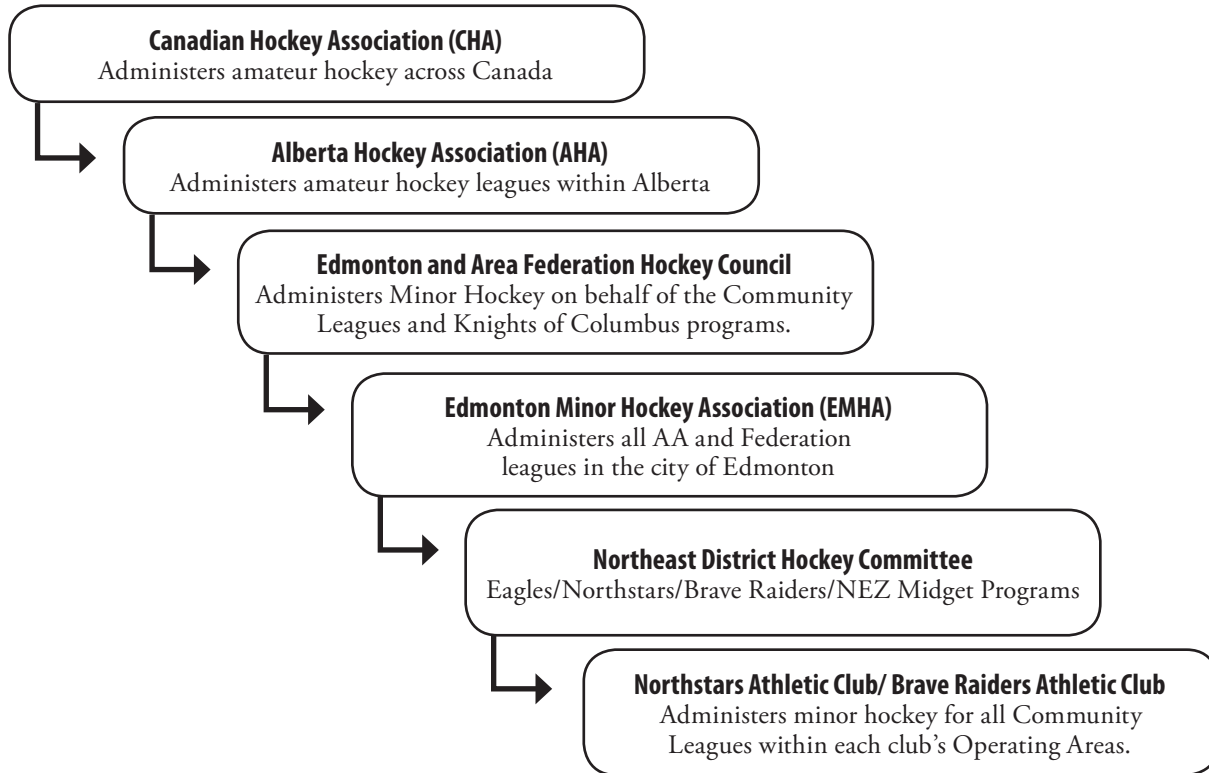
All the Brave Raiders/Northstar teams play approximately 22 league games according to category and tier, and receive approximately 13 City of Edmonton ice slots for practices per season. Each team will also play a minimum 2 games during Edmonton Minor Hockey Week in January of each year from Novice - Midget. Regular season is followed by a playoff round which will also guarantee a team 2 games from Novice-Midget.

Included in the Program:

- Player Development Programs
- Technical Development Clinics
- Checking Clinics
- Year End Wrap up Team & Organization Parties
- Coach Development and certification

The Northeast Zone Hockey Committee is responsible for administering the Midget 1, Bantam 1 and PeeWee 1 Hockey Program for the entire Northeast Edmonton District.

Registration

Registration fees are set by the Brave Raiders/ Northstars prior to the start of the season, based on the cost to run the program (Team registration fees, Referees, Ice, Equipment etc). Fees must be paid in full, and all documents received at the time of registration. If this is not possible, appropriate arrangements must be made prior to participation in Brave Raiders or Northstars activities. Remember, if your fees are not paid, and all documents are not received, your child is not eligible to participate. Both organizations believe in all children having the ability to play organized sports. Should you require financial assistance, please speak with the Executive of the organization you are registering with. Each case will be assessed independently and be held in strict confidence.

Registration Fundraising Obligations

At Registration you will be asked to sign up for Bingos and/or Rexall Place Concessions. Both Organizations also sell Grey Cup or Super Bowl Tickets to offset the cost of Registration.

REGISTRATION FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE other than under exceptional circumstances such as

EMHA Policy

Notwithstanding anything contained in any bylaw, regulation, or operating directive, or any other rule of the EMHA Board of Directors, Federation, Junior, or AA Hockey, registration as a player or member is not a right, but a privilege, and the EMHA Board of Directors reserves the right to refuse or revoke membership and or registration to anyone whose conduct or that of their parent, guardian or family has failed to comply with the values of our mission statement, vision statement or “Good of the Game” conduct requirements.

medical illness or injury that prevents further participation in the season, or relocation out of the City of Edmonton. Refunds will be pro-rated depending upon the percentage of the season completed and all refunds will be subject to a \$50.00 administrative fee. All refunds must be ratified by the Executive Committee.

Insurance

The Brave Raiders and Northstars, through its team registration fees, to EMHA, is part of the Canadian Hockey Association (CHA) National Insurance Program. This includes Comprehensive General Liability, Accidental Death and Dismemberment and Major Medical/Dental coverage.

The Major Medical/Dental coverage is a third line payer, who provides supplemental coverage to augment Provincial Health Care Plans and Private Insurance Plans. Any claims must first be routed through these channels before the CHA plan comes into effect.

Evaluation Process

Every Effort is made to ensure that the evaluation and tiering process is fair and equitable for everyone.

Hockey skills vary considerably. In general, players have a much more enjoyable experience when they play with other players of similar skill and ability. In order for the Brave Raiders and Northstars Organizations to achieve this, an evaluation process is necessary.

Player evaluations are conducted prior to each season to determine the level at which each child is capable of playing within his/her age category.

Evaluation sessions are structured to evaluate players on basic skills and overall hockey aptitude.

The Evaluation Committee shall include an appropriate number of knowledgeable people to observe each player on a variety of skills and drills, designed for their category of play. Evaluators must remain impartial. Often times the organizations reach out to evaluators not connected to our program.

Evaluations are based upon direct observation of demonstrated skills, player performance in game situations and input from previous coaches where applicable. In all cases, evaluations shall be consistent with the Objectives of the Organizations.

On-ice evaluation consists of two components:

- a. Skill evaluation drills;
- b. Scrimmages and/or exhibition games;

Initial placement for scrimmages is determined by the results of the skills evaluation and by the level of play of the previous season, where applicable.

All Players will be placed on team groups as a direct result of the evaluation scoring /scrimmage process and the number of players registered to play in each category (Novice, etc.)

THIS IS NOT THE FINAL TEAM!

Parents are encouraged to enroll their players in conditioning camps, hockey schools or take their children skating to break in new equipment and condition their body prior to the evaluation process. All of these help us place your child properly. Both the Northstars and the Brave Raiders offer a Summer Conditioning Camp.

Should you have questions or concerns regarding the evaluation process or placement of your child, please contact your Category Director, visit www.braveraiders.com or www.nstars.com for details.

A Category Director is a volunteer appointed by the Brave Raider/Northstars to oversee a particular category of play – i.e. Initiation, Novice, Atom, Pee wee and Bantam during the tiering process and throughout the hockey season, and to act as a liaison between teams and the organizations.

Selected coaches (if determined by this time) or Technical Instructors will step on the ice at this point to identify the final 3-5 players for a given team. Their selection must coincide with those of the Category Directors and Executive. A meeting is then held between coaches, technical instructors and Executive to finalize the players for each team.

NO TEAM IS FINAL UNTIL THE PRESIDENTS OF BOTH BRAVE RAIDERS AND NORTHSTARS SIGN OFF ON THE FINAL ROSTER.

The final phase of player movement may be done one-on-one with the player and the coach.

The Brave Raiders/Northstars have adopted a Hockey Canada approach to Evaluations and positive Player movement for the 2010/2011 season — Contact your Executive for Details!

Team Formation

Each team will ideally consist of an average 15 players /2 Goalies, depending on the number of registrants to a maximum of a 19 player roster. Upon completion of the evaluation process, the coach of the team your child has been selected for will notify you and arrange a team meeting.

Your registration fee provides for practice, technical program, league play, Minor Hockey Week and play-off ice. Typically teams will require more revenue to obtain additional practice ice, play exhibition games and enter tournaments both in Edmonton and out of town. The source for additional money for each team, which is not to exceed the limit set by the parental majority, is considered part of each parent's responsibility. These funds will be used to provide extra team activities and keep the team competitive in their category. All families will contribute equally to costs, either through direct payment or fundraising. All parents should consider additional costs as part of their commitment to their child's hockey season.

Once each team is finalized, the Coach, Category Director and Representative(s) of both the Brave Raiders and Northstars will meet with all team's parents (and players at certain categories/levels of play).

The Executive will outline organization requirements, expectations and timelines. The Coach will outline expectations, intentions, and rules for the team and set out to fill all team positions (Manager/Parent Rep/Jersey Parents etc.).

Team Duties assigned at your first parents meeting:

- **Team Manager:** works with coaches/parents, makes up team calendar and assists/aids in

ensuring the team runs smoothly. Sources Ice and potential tournaments

- **Equipment Manager:** looks after all equipment and jerseys
- **Treasurer:** provides monthly financial statements to parents and to the Northstars/Brave Raiders Treasurer
- **Parent Representative:** liaison between parents and team management
- **Stats Person:** (*optional*) records all player and team stats at the request of the coaches
- **Scorekeepers/Timekeepers:** must have two in the penalty box when home team and one when visitors. Responsible for recording information on the game sheet and operating the score clock.
- **Phone Person:** telephones all players for upcoming events or changes in the schedule
- **Fund Raising Director:** organizes fundraising events as team requires.

Players selected for a Northstars or Brave Raider team may play in various positions throughout the regular season. The coaches will be looking for their strength in positioning for the playoffs.

The Northstars/Brave Raiders emphasize player development through practice time and technical development; the players will not develop their skills during games. It is important all players attend these in order to play scheduled games.

Fundraising

All fundraising must be sanctioned by the organizations for which the teams belong. Teams must communicate their fundraising plans to the organization, and complete the fundraising request form. If permits are required, the organizations will provide the team direction to ensure a safe, successful and authorized event. All proceeds from the fundraising must be reported with the plans of how the funds will be spent. Alberta Gaming has very strict rules as to how teams / organizations must handle and spend monies raised through fundraising.

Trust Accounts

Trust accounts are maintained by each organization for which the teams plays under. At the end of the year, any funds remaining will be issued to the organization in trust, where the funds will be held for each player until used at a future date.

Grey Cup/Superbowl and Team Fundraising Policy (2010-2011)

For the 2010/2011 minor hockey season it has been decided that the Northstars will use the Grey Cup Pool tickets as their organization fundraiser and the Brave Raiders will utilize the Superbowl Pool tickets.

Distribution

- The Northstars will distribute Grey Cup Pool Ticket books to their team representatives on or by **October 1, 2010;**
- The Brave Raiders will distribute Grey Cup Pool Ticket books to their team representatives on or by **October 1, 2010;**
- Quantities of books assigned to each team will be pre-determined by the Northstars and Brave Raiders based on the financial objective set for this specific fundraiser by these parent organizations;
- The Initiation I and II program teams will not participate in this annual club fundraiser;
- The Initiation I program teams will however be required to work 1 Bingo or Rexall commitment while the Initiation II teams will be required to work 2 Bingos or Rexall commitments;

Deadlines

- The Northstars Grey Cup Pool Ticket books must be returned to the Northstars no later than 1 week (7 Days) prior to the Grey Cup game;
- The Brave Raiders Superbowl Pool Ticket books must be returned to the Brave Raiders no later than 1 week (7 Days) prior to the Superbowl game;
- Pick-up or Delivery arrangements are to be made with your Category Director;

Invoice

- Teams will receive an invoice for the quantity of either Grey Cup or Superbowl Pool ticket books they are assigned at the time of distribution of the books to the teams;
- Invoices are due in full upon return of all books from the teams to either the Northstars or the Brave Raiders one week prior to the game in each case;
- Invoices are to be paid with a team cheque – not cash;

Other Team Fundraising

- Once teams are formed and fundraising events are determined all teams must complete the Brave Raiders/Northstars Fundraising Request Form;
- The Fundraising Request Form must be forwarded with your team budget for the season to the appropriate executive through your Category Director no later than October 31st for review and approval;
- Your Category Director will advise your team of any additional requirements necessary for your event such as the Alberta Gaming and Liquor Control (AGLC) raffle licence;
- The Brave Raiders and Northstars will post team fundraising activities on their websites

Ice Allocation Policy (2010/2011)

This policy is for the allocation of all ice contracted and/or purchased by the Brave Raiders and the Northstars on behalf of its teams for use by its teams exclusively. Game Ice and Practice Ice allocated by EMHA is excluded from this policy as this ice is specifically assigned to teams as scheduled.

Practices to Games

(Inclusive of City Practice Ice Assigned To Teams)

- Novice, Atom, PeeWee will utilize a 2:1 Practice To Game Ratio to Assign extra ice;
- Bantam will utilize a 1:1 Practice To Game Ratio;

Contact

- Once teams are finalized teams must provide a comprehensive coaches and team management contact list to their Category Director and/or Ice Allocators;
- Team management contact information will also be made available to all other teams for ice requirement purposes;

Distribution

- Equal quantity of ice will be given to all teams (using the practice:game ratios above);
- Fair allocation of both early morning (ie. 6:00 a.m.) and early afternoon (i.e. 5:00 p.m.) weekday ice to all teams;
- Fair distribution of all weekend ice to all teams;
- Fair rotation of ice distribution to all teams by Arena locations;
- Ice will be allocated within 48 hours following receipt of Round 1,2, and 3 practice and game schedules from EMHA;

Subsidy

- Teams will be required to pay \$125 per hour for any and all ice assigned and/or purchased from the Brave Raiders and Northstars;
- Teams will be invoiced for the extra costs by parent organization (Northstars and/or Brave Raiders) issuing the ice;
- Teams may approach any and all sources of ice including private arenas, post-secondary schools, other hockey organizations, etc. for any ice required exceeding the Northstars/Brave Raiders allocations;

Responsibility

- Once allocated the ice becomes the property of the team to which it is allocated;
- Teams not wanting any or all ice allocated are responsible to use or trade ice as they will be responsible to pay for it (Do Not Leave This Too Late);
- Failure by teams to utilize or dispose of their ice in a timely and appropriate manner will result in coach disciplinary action;

Terms

- Ice allocated to teams will be invoiced immediately following the allocation(s);
- Teams will be responsible to pay ice bills in a timely manner;
- Payment #1 due November 30th for all ice allocated to a given team prior to that date;
- Payment #2 due January 31st for all ice allocated prior to that date and after November 30th;
- Any ice allocated after January 31st the invoice will be due prior to the teams' last scheduled EMHA game of the season;
- In order to meet payment dates teams may have to obtain nominal amounts from all families to generate the necessary funds;
- Failure by teams to pay ice invoices on time will result in refusal of travel and/or tournament play;

Coaching

The Northstars and Brave Raiders provide a high quality program for the players on every team, at every level. The program not only develops their hockey skills but also enhances their enjoyment of the game. It should also promote their growth as young adults capable of contributing effectively as members of their community. And most importantly they need to have fun!

The Organizations strongly believe in Mentoring future coaches as well, so if you or anyone you know is interested in coaching hockey visit www.braveraiders.com or www.nstars.com to contact an Executive Member.

It is extremely important that care be taken to select the right individuals to assume the coaching responsibilities:

- Coaches are selected on a combination of interrelated factors, Past coaching experience; Coaching knowledge; CHA Certification Levels.
- Coaches are required to pursue certification as a means to increase their effectiveness in player and team development, sportsmanship, and fair play.
- All coaching staff must submit to a Volunteer security check

- Coaches are required to attend coaches meetings, as required for information, guidance, and other related business.
- Coaches are required to wear the apparel provided by the organizations to all organization – and hockey – related events including league, tournament, minor hockey, exhibition and playoff games.

We recognize that player, family and school responsibilities take priority over hockey and parents are reminded our volunteer coaching staff may also have other commitments from time to time.

Coaches have full authority to discipline players and parents, including but not limited to benching players that fail to come to practice, participate in team events or are disruptive. Coaches are required to adhere to the EMHA rules and Respect in Sport Guidelines.

Coaching is not an easy job, but it is one of the most rewarding experiences when both coaches and parents remain focused on creating a positive, fun and fair experience for the players.

Tournaments

All Brave Raiders teams are required to participate in the Annual Brave Raiders Spring Tournament typically held around Easter.

The Northstars support the Jasper Extreme Tournament held in Jasper in the spring of each season.

Uniforms and Equipment

The Brave Raiders (Red & Black) and Northstars (Green & Gold) colors and styles are the identity of the clubs, and as such, substitutions, changes, or deviations cannot be made without the written consent of the respective club's Executive Committee.

Each team will be supplied with a home and away jersey for each player as well as two pairs of socks. In order to maximize the length of their use, players ARE NOT ALLOWED to wear these jerseys for practices and must supply their own practice jerseys.

Sets of team jerseys shall be carried in club-provided garment bags and laundered by appointed parents. **JERSEYS MUST NOT BE GIVEN TO PLAYERS.**

Team jerseys (not socks) must be returned in good condition at a specified date and time at the end of the season. Each team, upon team formation, is responsible for a \$250.00 Jersey/Equipment deposit to the appropriate organization, fully refundable when Equipment is returned and inspected at the end of the season.

Each player is responsible for obtaining the remainder of his or her own equipment. Insurance coverage dictates that each player must be fully equipped with CSA approved equipment.

Apparel Policy

Club jackets, tracksuits, T-shirts, toques, hats etc. are available for purchase through the Apparel Director. The use of club logos being altered or changed is absolutely prohibited. **All garments / apparel displaying the club**

Mouth guards are mandatory for all players.

Guidelines for Parents and Coaches Concerns

Each team must choose a Parent Representative who is not involved in running the team's day-to-day activities, to act as a liaison between the parents and coaching staff. (i.e. not the Coach, Manager, Treasurer etc.)

Any Disputes should be handled after a 24 hour cool down period. No disputes or concerns are to be handled in front of the Player(s)

Parents concerns with Coaches

A dispute or concern should be routed according to the following steps :

1. Report to the Parent Representative of the team.
If you are not satisfied with the response/action;
2. Report to your Category Director.
If you are not satisfied with the response/action;
3. Report to club executive, in writing or e-mail.

Please be objective with your concerns.

The Disputes & Arbitration Committee, where possible and appropriate, will conduct investigations to ensure fair resolution.

Communications

Discipline Guidelines

Hockey should be a positive experience with an emphasis on sportsmanship for all participants. Players, parents and team officials are encouraged to participate in a positive manner.

Remember, we are all volunteers and recognition of the efforts made by referees, opponents and other volunteers is encouraged. **Harassment of officials, opponents or teammates IS NOT ACCEPTABLE. Every team must have all participants and parents sign the For The Good Of The Game sheet and adhere to its guidelines.**

Game-related infractions, discipline and suspensions will be handled by the EMHA Disciplinary Chairperson.

The NE District Hockey Committee Commissioner tends to pre-game and post-game incidents, and negative conduct.

In each case a suspension may or may not be assessed under the EMHA Rules and Operating Directives. (Visit www.emha.ca)

Your home organization (Brave Raiders or Northstars) has the authority to add to any disciplinary decisions made at either level in the interest of their organization and its members.

Please Note: the Organizations may give extra suspensions to players incurring major, match and gross misconduct penalties in addition to any suspensions imposed by the EMHA.

NOTICE TO FANS

A Referee, City Category Director, District or City Director may stop a game at any time until a fan or fans who may be causing problems leaves the arena. The game will not proceed until such departure. Failure to leave results in forfeiture of the game by the offending team.

The rules used are those in the Canadian Hockey Association rule book, although minor modifications may be made by the EMHA to suit local conditions.

Recognition & Prevention of Abuse

In response to adverse events that have occurred over the past few years, the CHA has developed a comprehensive policy in this area.

The CHA and Brave Raiders/Northstars are part of the sporting community in our country committed to seeking better ways to keep our youth safe. Protecting participants from all forms of abuse and neglect, whether emotional, physical or sexual, is an important element of safety. The CHA considers any form of abuse or neglect unacceptable

and will do all it can to prevent this intolerable social problem. To this end, the CHA will promote awareness of all forms of abuse and neglect by providing educational materials and programs for participants, parents, volunteers, and staff members. Through the use of these strategies, we will send a clear message to all potential abusers and sexual predators that hockey participants are not easy targets. The CHA is committed to the highest possible standards of care for its participants.

POLICY

It is the policy of the CHA that there shall be no abuse and neglect, whether physical, emotional or sexual of any participant in any of its programs. The CHA expects every parent, volunteer and staff member to take all reasonable steps to safeguard the welfare of its participants and protect them from any form of maltreatment.

Volunteers

The Northstars and Brave Raiders are volunteer organizations, and as such, the strength and success of our organizations is directly dependent on the strength and support of the volunteers.

Volunteers are required at all levels including the Executive Committee, various sub-committees, fund raising and casino, tournament organization, Coaches, Managers and a host of other positions.

Please remember, sitting back and being critical will not make it better. Volunteers, some of whom put in very long hours so that your child can play this great Canadian game, run your program. When you refer to the volunteer as “THEM or THEY” — be careful, you are also speaking of yourselves. Our combined efforts will make the huge difference and benefit all those on the ice, so that they too can gain great memories.
